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Goals for Developmental Differences I

- Identify factors contributing to the presenting problem & design effective treatment for the developmental level of the client.
- Engage the client/ family in treatment through establishing attainable goals.
- Identify appropriate resources for client/family.



Part 1: Intellectual Disability, Giftedness, and Autism

- Skills Deficits
 - I couldn't even if I wanted to
 - Addressed through skill building for client.
 - Psychoeducation for family / teachers/ community partners.

- Motivation
 - "I don't want to."
 - Addressed through behavior / rewards systems.
 - Typically used in school and work settings.



Part 2: Atypical Development

- Asynchronous development
- Reduce the value judgement from atypical development.
- Atypical development = Increased Risk for challenges.








Figure 5.2 Graphic display of descriptive categories and corresponding percentages of individuals in each category.


