Goal of the Study

- Complete surveys about yourself, your child, and your perceptions of service delivery.
- Video-record activities with your child at home.
- Participate in trainings and weekly check-ins.
- Do an interview with the researcher.
- Collaborate with lead researcher to develop intervention plan for your chosen routine.
